# PROJECTS – Tokyo 2020

Co-funded by  
the European Union



- Meets all modalities of the Tokyo 2020 Program, and Lima 2019 as part of the road to Tokyo;
- Exclusive features for high yield stocks
  - Training competitions and campsites;
  - Purchase of equipment and materials;
- Training and evaluation phases, national or international competitions at the Training Centre, with reduced costs for the Confederation;
- Individual scholarship offer projects

# PROJECTS – Athletes Fund

Co-funded by  
the European Union



- Created with the purpose of financially supporting high performance athletes so that their chances of winning the Paralympic Games medal increase;
- The project has been running since 2009, but its format and criteria have been modified over the years. It is maintained by the main sponsor of the Brazilian Paralympic Committee, lottery fund and the administration of the funds is performed by CPB in partnership with the Company's representatives;
- Since the beginning, more than 480 athletes from 16 Paralympic modalities have been served;
- In 2019 there are 83 athletes served from 14 Paralympic modalities;
- Today the project has 05 levels of service, with a scholarship value for each level.



# PROJECTS – Athletes Fund

## ELIGIBILITY

- It serves Brazilian athletes from all regions of Brazil that represent a Club or Association duly registered and legalized in accordance with the law and the specific rules of registration in CPB;
- The athlete who meets the technical and results criteria established by the CPB Technical Board will be eligible for assistance, together with the Technical Coordinators of the modalities and within the financial and operational capacity of the resources made available;



# PROJECTS – São Paulo Team

- Created for the same purpose as the Caixa Athletes Project, which is to financially support high-performance athletes so that their chances of winning a medal at the Paralympic Games increase;
- Project maintained since 2011 by the São Paulo State Government, which the CPB manages the resources in partnership with the Secretariat of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities;
- Since the beginning, more than 380 athletes from 13 Paralympic modalities have been served;
- In 2019 there are 66 athletes served from 09 sports;
- The project has 05 service levels, with a scholarship value for each level.



# PROJECTS – São Paulo Team

## ELIGIBILITY

- It serves Brazilian athletes and, in this case, the athlete must necessarily reside in the State of São Paulo and represent a Club or Association that has its headquarters also in the State of São Paulo;
- The athlete who meets the technical and results criteria established by the CPB Technical Directorate, together with the Technical Coordinators of the modalities as well as with the consent of the representative of the Disability Rights Secretariat and within the capacity will be eligible for the aid. financial and operational performance of the resources;



# FEDERAL ATHLETE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME

Intended for the athlete's personal and sportive maintenance, so that they can leverage their preparation with the possibility of devoting more time to the training and recovery hours necessary for the evolution towards high performance;

Meets individual and collective modalities;

Specific Categories:

- Paralympic Games: R\$ 3.100,00
- International: R\$ 1.850,00
- National: R\$ 925,00
- Student: R\$ 375,00



# FEDERAL ATHLETE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME

## Criteria for selection

*Paralympic Scholarship:* To have been part of the Brazilian Delegation in the Paralympic Games of the pre-election cycle. The scholarship is valid for 04 years (the whole cycle) for athletes who prove international results each season of the Paralympic cycle, ie for the 04 years that make up the cycle. Still all annual documentation needs to be regularized with the Special Secretariat of Sport;

*International Scholarship:* To have been part of the Brazilian Delegation and won a medal in World Championship, Parapan American or Para-American Games - or equivalent event, in editions of the season prior to the election. Renewal is not automatic and the athlete must have results in competitions eligible for new membership.





# FEDERAL ATHLETE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME

## Relevant Topics

The CPB and other national confederations are not responsible for administering the Program and scholarships to athletes. This attribution is from the Special Secretariat of Sport itself. National entities assist, indicate and official documents regarding athletes' sporting results;

Mandatory indication in case of other sponsorships;

The scholarship is paid in 12 instalments;

Athletes of non-Paralympic sports may apply for scholarships, but must have a sports history of at least 03 years with expressive results and within the established criteria;

May not be in debt to accountability;

In 2018, over 1300 athletes were awarded one of the scholarships offered.



# ATHLETE SCHOLARSHIP - State and Municipal

- Some state and municipal administrations are already running incentive projects for Paralympic athletes in the form of athlete grants. The criteria for election, acceptance and accountability differ in each project, but in essence the parameters are very similar to the Federal Athlete Grant Program;
- Currently, 08 states and 16 municipalities have a scholarship program for athletes;
- The CPB, as the top entity of Paralympic sport in the country, has the prerogative to assist in this process with the administrations and later the Clubs and athletes, as well as the obligation to disclose updated and reliable national competition results reports and rankings.

## Overview

Created at the end of 2012, after the great success of Brazilian athletes at the London Paralympic Games, in the same year.

Aimed at Brazilian athletes of individual modalities who have already reached a technical level that qualify them the direct dispute of the medal in the Paralympic Games at the end of the cycle.

4 levels of scholarship are offered according to the specific terms of the Law and technical criteria defined by the Working Group formed by representatives of the CPB and the Special Secretariat of Sport of the Federal Government.

## Criteria and Claim

R\$15.000,00

- Being in the top 3 of the world ranking;
- Have been a medallist in the last edition of Paralympic Games or World Championship (or equivalent).

R\$11.000,00

- Being in the top 8 of the world ranking;
- Have participated in the final at the last Paralympic Games or World Championship (or equivalent).

R\$8.000,00

- Being in the top 16 of the world ranking;
- Have been top 16 in the last edition of Paralympic Games or World Championship (or equivalent).

R\$5.000,00

- Being in the top 20 of the world ranking;
- Have been top 20 in the last edition of Paralympic Games or World Championship (or equivalent).

## Relevant Topics

Mandatory indication in case of other sponsorships;

The scholarship is paid in 12 instalments;

In 2018, 158 athletes from 18 Paralympic modalities were assisted;

Renewal is not automatic and the athlete must maintain (or improve) his position in the international ranking at the time of publication of the notice by the Special Secretariat of Sport;

- If the athlete performs worse than last season, but still meets the criteria of the Podium, he will be downgraded, but still within the Project;
- If the athlete does not meet the criteria for renewal, he / she will return to the Athlete Scholarship Project to which he / she is entitled by his / her marks, provided that he / she makes the claim in accordance with the law and within the deadline.

## Relevant Topics

Detailed sports plans are required at the time of the election, which are analysed according to the coherence with the Project objectives, ie the Paralympic medal;

The administration of the Special Sports Secretariat also sends a semi-annual report to the coordinators of each sport to validate and / or adjust the sports plans of each athlete. Indications of possible changes are possible and, when they exist, are reviewed by the Special Working Group.
